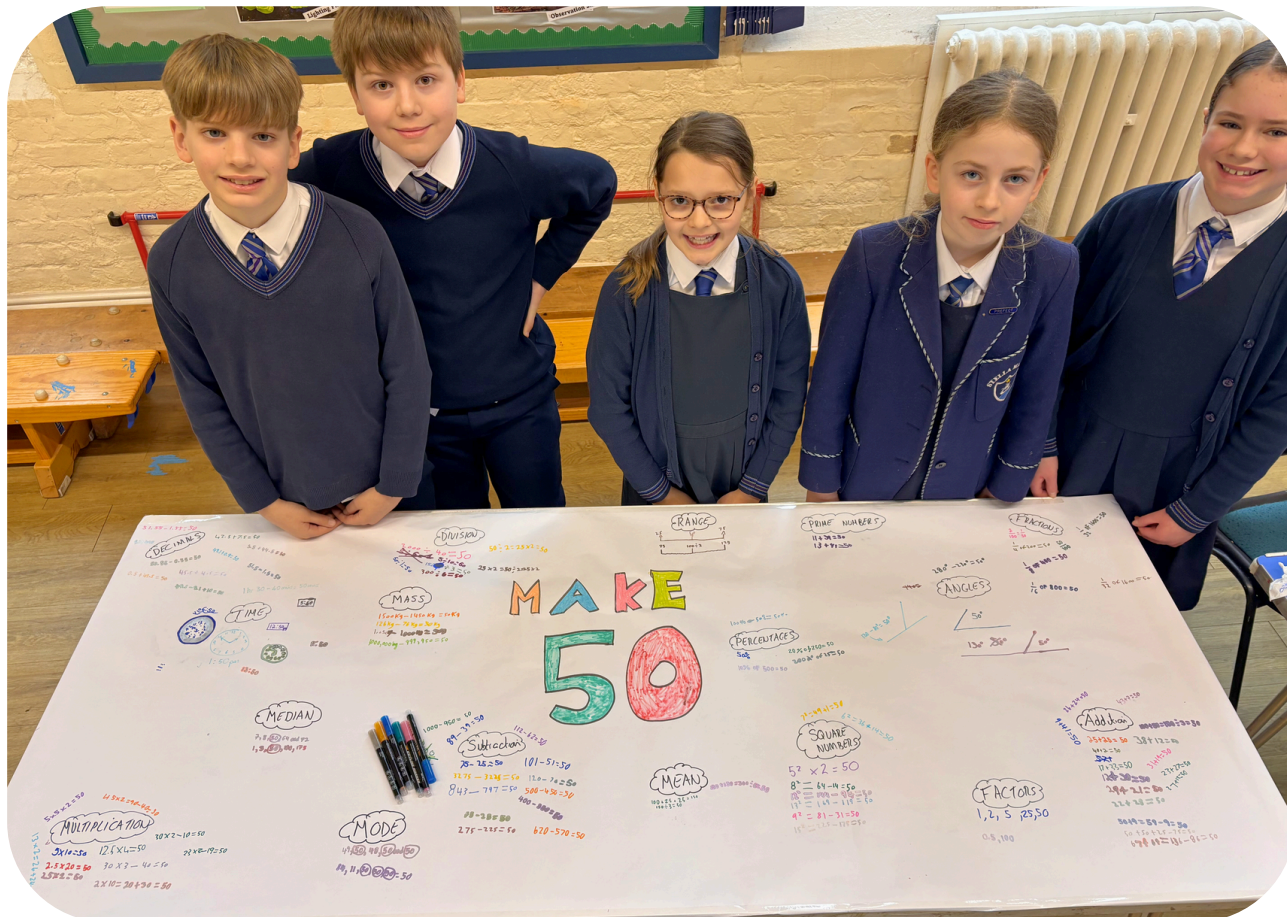
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CLASS NEWS

Year 4/5

This week, Years 4 and 5 became space explorers during a Solar System scavenger hunt, using the internet to research fascinating facts about our Solar System. They learned about the extreme conditions of different planets, from the freezing temperatures of the outer gas giants to the huge volcanoes on Mars, and discovered that the Sun is made mainly of hydrogen and helium. In Maths, the children continued to develop their multiplication skills, moving from grid and expanded methods towards the formal column method and tackling increasingly challenging numbers with growing confidence.

Year 6

We are very proud to announce that all of the pupils in Year 6 have been invited for interview at their first choice grammar school. This means that they must have performed extremely well in their examinations. Well done children! They have been busy this week preparing for and attending their respective interviews so fingers crossed for a positive outcome.

Pre-Prep

We have been continuing our work on British Birds by conducting bird surveys in the school garden. We have spotted several different types of birds and are becoming better at identifying some common species. We then used the information we collected to make a simple bar chart, comparing the birds we saw and how many. We will continue to feed the birds in the school garden during the winter and spring months when their food is scarce.

Year 1/2

It has been another busy week for Years 1 and 2. In PSHE, the children explored the 'right thing to do' in and around school, completing a worksheet and a 'Respect' word search. In Maths, they revised their learning about money and all did really well on a mini assessment. English lessons focused on play scripts, with the class re-reading Little Red Riding Hood and acting out the story. In History, the children learned about the travels of Christopher Columbus.
