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# CLASS NEWS



## Pre-Prep

This week, we spent time thinking about Remembrance, saying thanks to the brave soldiers in the war. We visited the war memorial and placed the poppy that we made. In maths, we learnt about repeating patterns and made lots of necklaces using beads to help improve our learning. We also started a mini topic on hibernation, having so much fun pretending to be hibernating hedgehogs!

## Year 4/5

Throughout the Anti-bullying week, children have shown a commendable positive attitude towards the essential messages of this initiative. Mr Brown is proud of their understanding and support.

In English, children showcased their creativity by writing out potential conflict scenarios as stories. We were impressed by their ability to be imaginative while also demonstrating correct spelling, grammar, and punctuation.

In RE, children demonstrated their understanding and ability to recognise bullying in its various forms. They also learned effective strategies to support one another if they witness bullying taking place.

## Year 1/2

The children in Year 1-2 have had a thoughtful and busy week of learning. On Tuesday, they joined the whole school for our Service of Remembrance and later visited the War Memorial to lay their poppies and pay their respects. In Maths, they revisited 2D and 3D shapes and explored new vocabulary such as symmetry, horizontal and vertical. In PSHE, they continued their work on understanding bullying and its consequences, and in French they enjoyed learning the names of different vegetables.

## Year 6

Year 6 have had a really busy week. They have been developing their story writing skills and can show how they can write with creativity and flair in a timed situation. During their Maths lessons, they continued to study angles and in particular use what they know to find missing angles in triangles and when 2 straight lines intersect at a point. They loved observing how exercise effects the body during their fitness lesson in P.E on Wednesday. On Thursday, they had the opportunity to paint their Greek pottery- which they took such pride in!
