

CLASS NEWS

Year 1/2

This week we have been busy retelling the story of The Three Little Pigs, using story language and sequencing correctly. We've completed our rainy day pictures, which can be seen displayed in the classroom. We really enjoyed forest school where we worked on our physical skills climbing the big hill!

Year 4/5

It has been a busy and productive week for our Year 4 and 5 pupils, with great work taking place in both Science and Literacy. In Science, the children learned about the life cycle of a butterfly, exploring each stage in detail and using new vocabulary such as larvae, pupa and chrysalis. They produced clear, well-presented reports that showed a strong understanding of the topic. In Literacy, the class worked on retelling Aesop's fable The Lion and the Mouse, giving everyone the chance to focus on their individual writing targets. Pupils concentrated on improving their punctuation, dialogue and descriptive language, and took real pride in their work. Their retellings were thoughtful, detailed and full of effort, and it was wonderful to see their enthusiasm throughout the week.

Year 6

Year 6 have had a busy and focused week. In Maths, they revisited key areas from recent assessments, including algebraic formulas, expressions, substitution, and long division. In English, they worked on comprehension and wrote creative openings to "The Path That Wasn't There Yesterday."

They also put great effort into improving their fitness in P.E. and are thoroughly enjoying the class reader The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe.
