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CLASS NEWS

Pre-Prep

What a lovely week back in school! We've been retelling the story of Goldilocks & The Three Bears, using costumes and props. The children were so good at using story language and sharing roles. We spent time thinking about Remembrance Sunday, making poppy paintings and poppy collages using leaves we collected on our Daily Mile walk.

Year 4/5

The first week back has been a busy but a highly productive one. In Geography, our exploration of the topic of North America continued as we began a study of its agriculture. The students took an active role in this, creating a comprehensive table in our topic books, detailing the amount of land used for each crop and the revenue it generated for the US. This provided valuable insights into the economic aspects of agriculture, engaging them in the learning process.

In History, we used the Ancient Greek alphabet to make a poster. The children, working in groups, collaborated to write their names on it using Ancient Greek letters. This fostered a sense of community and teamwork among the students.

Year 1/2

The children in Year 1-2 have worked hard this week! In English, they practised comprehension through a Remembrance Day activity. In Maths, they began a new topic on Shape, revising 2D and 3D shapes through workbook tasks and games. In History, they learned about Bonfire Night and created colourful drawings to go with their work. French lessons were full of fun as they revised numbers to 20 and played Hangman to practise days of the week. During Religion, the class watched a Remembrance Day video, discussed how soldiers can inspire us, and made poppies to mark the occasion.

Year 6

Year 6 have returned to school refreshed and ready to learn. This week during Maths, the students have been using a protractor to measure and draw acute, obtuse and reflex angles as well as revising long multiplication. They've written a short story entitled 'The Mystery Parcel' and we read the opening chapter of the C S Lewis' classic- 'The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe' to examine how to write a good opening for a story with creativity and flair.
