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CLASS NEWS

Pre-Prep

We've had another busy week in Pre-prep, continuing work on our 3D windmill models, adding sails that spin and doors that open and close. We were busy in the garden too, making water droppers for the raised beds and pots - thanks to the PTA for supplying those and thanks to everyone who donated bottles.

Year 4/5

The children continue to work hard in all areas of the curriculum. In Science, as part of our focus on the life cycle of plants, which includes stages such as seed, germination, growth, and reproduction, the children examined lilies to investigate how flowers develop and how they use their bright colours and beautiful scent to attract birds and insects, which in turn help spread pollen.

In Art, the pupils have not only examined ancient Greek vases and the symbols and patterns commonly used, but they have also shown remarkable creativity in experimenting with their own designs. Their artistic creativity is terrific to see.

Year 1/2

Our Year 1 and 2 children have been hard at work this week! In Maths, they've been sequencing numbers up to 100 and practising their addition and subtraction skills. In English, they enjoyed the story My Favourite T-Shirt and discovered how posters and labels can share useful information. Science lessons saw them exploring the four seasons, while in Phonics they tackled some tricky words to boost their spelling.

Year 6

The children in Year 6 have been very studious this week! During their Music lesson they have been learning some spooky songs and one of the pupils even taught the whole group a Halloween song that she had composed herself! During Science, they have started to examine plants to learn about life cycles. In Maths, they've become masters of ratio and practised ratio with real life problem solving. During English lessons, they learnt where it is appropriate to include a colon in their writing.
