Pre-Prep

We've had a busy week in Pre-prep practising our handwriting and learning new sounds in phonics. We also learnt about the properties of 2D shapes in Maths. Then, we completed our very colourful autumn-themed collages which are now on display in the classroom!

Year 4/5

The Year 4 and 5 children have continued their excellent start to the new school year, displaying not only good focus and organisational skills, but also a growing sense of responsibility and independence. In English, our students have been honing their creative writing skills. They were given the task of describing a lighthouse on a stormy night, and it was truly inspiring to see them employ a wide range of literary skills to bring the scene to life. Their progress in this area is something to be proud of.

In Mathematics, we continued to look at 'the powers of ten' where we can quickly compare, increase or decrease numbers by 10, 100 and 1000. It's heart-warming to see children dealing so confidently with numbers up to a million and beyond!

Year 1/2

The children in Year 1-2 have really enjoyed their learning this week and have continued to enjoy the morning mile! During their Maths lessons, they have revised their recent learning of place value. Everyone scored well on a mini assessment.

In PSHE, they talked about feelings and how to express them.

During their French lesson, the children learnt the French words for sweet treats and cakes. They also really enjoyed our class story called 'The Tiger Who Came To Tea'. The class literacy lessons this week have been based around the book.

Year 6

The children in Year 6 have been really busy this week! During their Maths lessons they have been consolidating the skills that they learnt about last week when they plotted coordinates in all 4 quadrants. This week they've been translating and reflecting shapes in the x and y axis. During English lessons, they learnt how to build an atmosphere in their creative story writing by including expanded noun phrases and a cliff hanger at the end. They've really enjoyed joining their friends in other year groups for the foundation subjects during the afternoon sessions too.
